When was the Indus Valley Civilisation?

3200BC

The start of the civilisation was around 3200BC.

1900BC

The civilisation flourished until around 1900BC.

6500BC

Around 6500BC the first people started settling in one area, growing crops and keeping animals. Villages and towns began to form.

2600BC

The first cities like Harappa and Mohenjo-Daro weren't built until roughly 2600BC.

1300BC

The civilisation was abandoned by 1300BC.

Why were the rivers so important?



The rivers flowed down from the mountains. The nutrients from the mountains were transported to the land in the valleys when the rivers flooded their banks, making the soil perfect for growing crops.

Cities were built close to the rivers so people had access to water for cooking, cleaning and drinking.

The rivers also provided an efficient way to transport goods to be traded.





The Cities - Water



Wells were common.

Larger houses might have their own wells in a courtyard.

The city walls could just as easily have been built to protect them from flood water as from invaders.



Transport

Most people wouldn't stray far from the city, but traders had to travel to trade their goods. The methods some people use in the region today give us clues to how they travelled in the past.
